- If you have any concerns relating to the well being or safety of a young person in our school community, you must share your concern with a DSL immediately.


WHAT IS SAFEGUARDING?

- Protecting children from maltreatment
- Preventing impairment of children's health or development
- Ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care.
- Taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.

PROTECTING THE CHILD: 4 RS

- Recognise looking for cluster of signs, changes in behaviour & patterns.
 Be vigilant and observational.
- Respond assess situation, affirm a disclosure & record facts. You cannot promise confidentiality.
- Refer share with DSL & Safeguarding team as soon as possible.
- Reflect track and monitor the concern.
 Follow up and measure impact for the child.
