THIS POLICY WILL HELP THE SCHOOL TO FULFIL ITS AIMS BY:

1. Developing lively, inquiring minds which are capable of independent thought

- 2. Helping all pupils prepare for adult life, through an awareness of the changing global dimensions of employment and study
- 3. Seeking to foster a spirit of co-operation which appreciates individual differences and encourages mutual respect
- 4. Seeking a stimulating and caring school where students are confident and respect others and upholds the school's British Values

THE OBJECTIVES OF THIS POLICY WILL BE TO PROMOTE:

- 1. An integrated international dimension throughout the whole school curriculum
- 2. Wider experiences for both staff and pupils
- 3. The removal of barriers between cultures, groups and individuals
- 4. Promotes British Values, particularly mutual respect and tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs
- 5. An international programme within our local partner schools
- 6. Links with international partner schools, to enhance the learning and teaching opportunities available either directly (through exchanges and visits) or indirectly, through technology
- 7. International education business links wherever possible

TO FULFIL THIS POLICY THE SENIOR LEADERSHIP TEAM AND GOVERNORS OF THE SCHOOL WILL AIM TO:

- 1. Extend students' knowledge of a wide range of cultures and languages other than their own
- 2. Extend students' awareness of the historical, geographical, political and economic circumstances which have led to diversity both at home and abroad.
- 3. Promote a sense of international identity, encouraging respect for and appreciation of the cultural, linguistic and religious diversity in the world.
- 4. Encourage students to develop informed views to counter cultural bias
- 5. Enable students to be confident and courteous in the company of people from other cultures
- 6. Make students aware of their rights and responsibilities as 'global' citizens
- 7. Equip students with the skills, training and qualifications needed to allow them to take advantage of worldwide opportunities
- 8. Offer opportunities to work with foreign nationals in the classroom.
- 9. Seek funding and resources through appropriate EU and other agencies/programmes

10. Monitor and annually review the international dimension of the school's work through the SIP ASSOCIATED POLICIES: EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES AND CURRICULUM
