Dear Parents

I write to highlight the national changes in regards to self-isolation and daily Lateral Flow Device Testing. This is particularly important as this advice now pertains to **primary age children from the age of five.**

The following is taken from local and national guidance released yesterday:

From Tuesday 14 December, people who are fully vaccinated and identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 – whether Omicron or not – should take an NHS rapid lateral flow test every day for 7 days to help slow the spread of COVID-19.

Daily rapid testing applies to all contacts who are:

fully vaccinated adults – people who have had 2 jabs all children aged 5 to 18 years and 6 months, regardless of their vaccination status people who can prove they are unable to be vaccinated for clinical reasons people taking part, or have taken part, in an approved clinical trial for a COVID-19 vaccine

Under 5s are exempt from self-isolation and do not need to take part in daily rapid lateral flow testing.

Unvaccinated adults are not eligible for this new daily testing policy, they must self-isolate for 10 days if they are a contact of someone who tests positive for COVID-19 – Omicron or not – unless eligible for an existing workplace daily contact testing.

If they test positive, they should self-isolate and <u>order a PCR test</u> to confirm the result. If the PCR is positive, they must self-isolate for 10 days. If the PCR test is negative, they no longer need to self-isolate but should continue to carry out the remainder of the daily tests, and only need to isolate if it is positive.

All secondary aged students should have access to a box of 7 LFD tests from their education setting. For primary aged children <u>LFD test kits are available through the usual routes</u> (community test sites, local pharmacies or online).

Our Year 8s, who have been working remotely this week, may now return to onsite lessons at school on Wednesday 15th December, provided are not displaying any COVID-19 symptoms.
