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Dear Parent / Carer,

I am pleased to let you know that The Piggott School is offering the **Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award** (DofE) to students in Year 9.

The DofE is a great chance for your child to broaden their horizons, discover new interests and talents, have fun with friends, develop essential skills for their future and achieve an internationally renowned Award. As Piggott's DofE Coordinator, I wanted to tell you some information about what a DofE programme involves, the benefits for your child and how they can sign up.

About the DofE

The DofE is non-competitive and open to all young people – it's about setting personal challenges and pushing personal boundaries. There are three levels of the DofE programme which, when successfully completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award.

Through their DofE, students will make friends, memories and build their confidence, resilience, and independence. Participants gain skills and attributes for work and life, like problem-solving, team-working and self-motivation — and they'll achieve an Award that is recognised by employers and can help them stand out when applying for university or jobs.

The Bronze Award requires the participants to commit to a range of extra-curricular activities which are assessed in four sections: **Skills, Volunteering, Physical** and **Expedition** to be completed by the start of September 2023.

Every young person's DofE programme is personal to them – they choose one activity per section (Skills, Volunteering and Physical), most activities can count. I will provide guidance and support, and students can either choose to continue an activity they already do or discover something new.

The DofE requires commitment and perseverance. Activities for each section take a minimum of **one hour a week** over a set period of time (two activities for **3 months** and one activity for **6 months**), so they can fit around studying, hobbies and social lives. Once complete, they will have shown their progress, commitment, and dedication for their chosen activities. For more details about programmes and timescales visit www.bofE.org/do.

eDofE and the DofE app

Participants create their DofE programme and record their progress using eDofE, the DofE's digital system, available online at eDofE.org and through the DofE app – downloadable for free from Google Play and the App Store. If your child decides to enrol, I will set up their eDofE account and they will receive details of how to sign in and get started.







Signing up

The cost of signing up to the DofE is £32 per participant. This covers the DofE registration fee for your child's participation place, a contribution towards the school's admin costs and DofE licence fees, and the participant's Welcome Pack, which will be sent to their home address and includes their personalised DofE Discount Card.

The Expedition

Please find the details of the expedition on the next page. There is an additional cost for the Expedition.

DofE Bronze Certificate of Achievement

If your child cannot, or does not wish to, take part in this expedition then the DofE offer participants a Certificate of Achievement for successfully completing the other three sections of the Award: Skills, Volunteering and Physical. If your child would like to take part in the DofE, please complete this <u>enrolment/consent form</u> and make the payment of £32 to cover their enrolment in the programme by **Friday 30**th **September**. The Expedition

The DofE Expedition section is being provided by BXM Outdoors, an outdoor education company that the school have used before.

The dates are as follows:

Saturday 28th January 2023 Training Day (at school)

Thursday 20th – Friday 21st April 2023 Practice Expedition (residential - location tbc)

Friday 5th – Saturday 6th May 2023 Qualifying Expedition (residential - location tbc)

What does this involve?

Training Day: This will be an opportunity for the participants to learn a variety of skills that will be necessary for their DofE Expedition. This will include map and compass reading, cooking outdoors, what to pack and why, meal planning, the DofE 20 conditions, and route planning for their own expedition.

Practice Expedition: Day 1 will be walking in their group with an instructor putting what they learnt in their training day into practice. They will cook their own evening meal and camp overnight. Day 2 will be more independent, with remote supervision from the instructors.

Qualifying Expedition: Both days are walking in their group with remote supervision. Again, they will cook their own evening meal and camp overnight. The students will be assessed on how well they have achieved the DofE 20 conditions.

To achieve the full Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award, participants must successfully complete the Expedition section, including appropriate training and practice. The training day will be held in school. Both the practice and qualifying expeditions include overnight camping and will take place at a relatively local venue. Exact timing and locations will be confirmed in due course. Parents will be responsible for transporting their children to and from the start and finish points.

Payment and Consent

The total cost of the Bronze Expedition is expected to be approximately an additional £210 per student – the exact amount will be confirmed once we know how many students wish to participate.

If you would like your child to participate in this expedition, please complete the enrolment/consent form linked above and pay the deposit. Once we have confirmed the final cost, you may pay the balance as soon as you wish, but if you prefer to spread the cost, please meet the following payment dates as a minimum:

First Deposit £50 7th October 2022 Interim £80 4th November 2022

Final balance (tbc) £80 3rd February 2023 *NB: final cost is dependent on participant numbers

Should your child wish to withdraw from the expedition, we are able to issue refunds (less £5 admin) if we receive notice before the Christmas holidays. After this, refunds cannot be made for any costs which we have incurred in booking your child's place unless we are able claim on insurance.
