20 th Sept	Jesus Meets... John the Baptist (Mark 1:1-13) - HUMILITY - John is baptising people in the river Jordan who want forgiveness for sins. Jesus rocks up and asks John to baptise him. John says no because he knows who Jesus is. He knows that Jesus is the messiah, the one who's come to save everyone's sins and take them on himself, because he is sinless. So John asks Jesus to baptise him! But Jesus has no arrogant bone in his body and shows his HUMILITY and tells John he needs to baptise him to fulfil all righteousness. When do we act with humility and put away our arrogance? When do we step aside to allow others to shine? When do we submit to authority with humility and patience? 26 th Sept	Jesus Meets.... Satan (Matthew 4:11) - HAS AUTHORITY OVER EVIL AND KNOWS SCRIPTURES - Just before Jesus starts his public ministry he is led into the wilderness by Satan where he is tempted three times to bow down and worship Satan. Turning a stone into bread, throwing himself off a high building and commanding the angels to catch him and having all the worlds splendour given to him by Satan if he bows down to worship him. But each time Jesus resists the temptations and uses the scriptures in the Bible to defend himself from evil and Satans temptations. Jesus clearly shows he knows the scriptures and uses them to overcome evil and temptation. When do we have authority and use it well? When do we overcome evil with good? 3 rd Oct	<p>Jesus Meets... <i>The first disciples (Mark 1:16-20) - LEADERSHIP AND INCLUSIVE</i> - When Jesus meets the first disciples they're doing their day job, fishing. Jesus calls over to them to see if they've caught anything. They reply saying they've been up all night and caught nothing. Jesus says, throw your net on the other side, they catch so many fish that their boat starts to sink. Jesus looks them in the eye and says, "follow me". They immediately drop their nets and follow him. Jesus shows he has amazing leadership and inclusivity as not only do these men leave their livelihood to follow a man they've just met but Jesus has picked first the dregs of society when it comes to people and status. Fishermen were the lowest of the classes, they were smelly and extremely hard working. When do we show good leadership that has both authority and inclusivity? 10 th Oct	<p>Jesus Meets... <i>Wedding banquet - Water into wine - (John 2:1-12) NEVER EMBARRASSES ANYONE</i> - Jesus and his disciples get invited to a wedding banquet. Weddings lasted about three days so the food and wine would've needed to last that long too. But after the first day the wine runs out. Mary, Jesus' mother, comes to him and asks him to do something. Jesus replies that his time hasn't yet come and he isn't yet going public with his ministry or miracles and healing. She pleads with him and he consents. He orders the servers to fill six jars with water to the brim. He then prays a blessing over the water jars and miraculously the water turns into wine. The master of the banquet tastes the wine and tells everyone that this is the best wine he's ever tasted and that usually the best wine is served first, then when people have drunk a fair bit that's when they serve the cheap wine. But Jesus saves the best till last. He shows that not only does he only serve the best, he never embarrasses anyone to make a point. In fact the chap who made the wine ended up leaving his wine making livelihood and followed Jesus too! When do we go beyond expectations and save the best until last? 7 th Nov	<p>Jesus Meets... <i>A centurion - Jesus served - (Matthew 8:5-13) - HAS AUTHORITY</i> - A man with authority approaches Jesus and asks him to heal his servant. Jesus offers to go to his house and heal them but the centurion says “Lord, I do not deserve to have you enter my house, but just say the word and my servant will be healed.” The centurion is clearly a man with power and many men under his authority, yet he submits to Jesus and his authority which would’ve been unheard of in those days. Jesus didn’t have an army, he didn’t have a uniform, he wasn’t a Roman. What Jesus had was faith, a great relationship with God and people who followed him because he spoke truth. The centurion returned home and his servant was fully healed. When do we have authority and yet serve others.
