PE Grant and Sports Funding Statement 2021-2022

In the academic year 2021-2022 the government will provide additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. For the academic year 2021-2022, The Piggott School: Charvil Primary will receive £17,760. In addition, £5512 will be carried over from 2020 – 2021, increasing the total to £23,272.

Brief overview of PE and sport provision in the school:

The Piggott School: Charvil Primary's vision is to inspire and facilitate a lifelong love of PE and sport. We provide all pupils with two sessions of high quality PE each week. Units of work are blocked for each half term. The lessons in Foundation Stage are aimed at physical development and follow the Early Learning Goals. In KS1 and KS2 the lessons follow the National Curriculum Programmes of Study. Swimming is taught for one term per year in Key Stage 2 for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6.
