Foundation - Autumn



In Foundation we have been looking at the changing seasons and the start of Autumn. We went on an Autumn walk to see the **vibrant** colours and explore the **crackling** dry leaves and the **spiky** conker cases. We found out that the leaves change colour because the green **chlorophyll**, is all used up so the other colours show. We did an experiment to test this, which took a long time because nature works slowly.



We found out more about autumn from a **non-fiction** book and listened to the story of Leaf Man (which is **fiction**, which means it is pretend). Then we made our own leaf man pictures and worked together to write postcards from Leaf Man to tell his leaf family what he could see in the woods.

We looked really closely at some autumn leaves and copied their colours and patterns onto a leaf template. We all worked together to paint autumn leaves with our fingertips onto a class autumn tree, and we made hedgehog pictures decorated with leaf glitter. We learned some **facts** about hedgehogs: they are **nocturnal** and they **hibernate** in winter, so on Fresh Air Friday we made hedgehog homes in the garden and we hope some hedgehogs will find them comfy!



Gorse Ride Football Match— Wednesday 19th October 2022

The mixed Charvil Piggott football team went to Gorse Ride School to play their first match of the season. We kicked off the first half with a dominating performance. They had the first shot with a perfect pass slotted past our defence. It was a scuffed shot which proved simple for our keeper (Ruari Mclean) to save. We got the first goal with an awesome shot by Joseph Parker. We were 1-0 up and dominating the game, the midfield were creating chance after chance but the opposition's defence were proving a tough challenge.

Later on however, in the second half it was as if the other team had a new squad. Their left wing kept on smashing in crosses time and time again really adding the pressure. Fortunately, Joseph got another opportunity which he finished with pinpoint accuracy making the score 2-0 the chance was put on a plate by Harry Sharp.

Later on in the match, they got a corner which sailed towards the back post where an unmarked player was lurking for the tap in. The score was now 2-1, the pressure was on and there was 10 minutes remaining. 
