Apprenticeships have evolved over the last few years and offer students unique opportunities to earn a wage whilst they work and study. There are several types of apprenticeships, with many including a qualification, such as a degree. All the training is free meaning that students are debt-free and finish their apprenticeship with significant industry experience.

Students will spend some time during tutor sessions focusing on apprenticeships and the week will give all students the opportunity to consider various post-Piggott options.
