### **PE Grant and Sports Funding Statement 2024-2025**

In the academic year 2024-2025, the government will continue to provide funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. Schools are expected to use this capital and show how this will benefit the school community.

For the 2024-2025, The Piggott School: Charvil Primary will receive £17,890.

#### **Brief overview of PE and sport provision at The Piggott School: Charvil Primary:**

Creating a lifelong enjoyment of physical education, sports, and being active through participation and competitive competition is the objective of physical education at The Piggott School: Charvil Primary. Every week, we offer two sessions of physical education to every student from Year 1-6 with Foundation Stage receiving one session (alongside regular, continuous provision to enhance physical development).

Our PE curriculum is mapped out in units of work that include a variety of both indoor and outdoor based sports, each lasting half a term. Each year group will learn and develop the skills required within two sporting areas across a half term. Lessons will incorporate understanding of the sport through a physical, psychological and health-based perspective.

Units have been re-organised for a fair balance of sporting domains to be taught and for clear progression. With this, children get the opportunity to learn a sporting area on three opportunities across their primary education journey. Additionally, to enhance our inclusive approach to sport, the curriculum will also incorporate a more SEN-orientated unit for each year, comprising of: boccia, kurling and goalball.

The Early Learning Goals are used as a guide for the Foundation Stage teachings, which focus on physical development. Lessons in KS1 and KS2 adhere to the National Curriculum Programs of Study.

Years 4, 5, and 6 receive specialised swimming lessons for one term of each academic year.
